Training Tips

Deflection and Pre-Arrest Diversion (D/DPAD) is community based, and being inclusive is the way to develop and implement your program or initiative. Present at community forums, colleges, libraries, local and regional agency venues and the media.

Memorandums of Understanding (MOU)'s or Agreement (MOA's) are important for programs to set guidelines and standards between organizations. Examples of MOU's can be found on our website. Instead of starting from scratch, see what is out there to modify for your own use. These MOU's help ensure everyone knows who is responsible for which program components and procedures. Collaborate with your partners in developing agreements so each has buy-in to the document, as well as support and signatures from leadership.



Data and Evaluation are critical components for your D/DPAD program or initiative.

Plan to include this from the inception, collecting relevant information such as demographics, officer use of the program and recidivism. Publish quarterly reports and discuss outcomes with the team, improving areas that need attention and recognizing positive efforts and successes.
