What has Civil Citation Network been up to?

- They have been consulting with various groups across Florida on the benefits of civil citation, a pre-arrest diversion program with 5 components: Public Safety, Collaboration, Justice Equity, Access to Services and Data Driven Evaluation.
- They have been working with circuits in North Florida on adult pre-arrest diversion and the integration of criminal justice and behavioral health.
- They presented on replication of the juvenile civil citation model to the ONDCP.
- Their website continues to be updated weekly with new information and resources.
- They recently partnered with the National Institute of Mental Health (NIMH) on the National Center for Health and Justice Integration for Suicide Prevention (NCHATS) and Ms. Duncan will be representing CCN in Detroit at the NCHATS All Center Meeting
 - They attended the PTACC National Leadership meeting in DC.
 - They have submitted a proposal to present at a state behavioral health conference.
 - Ms. Duncan is the chair for the PTACC annual deflection summit
 in Denver this Oct.

Training Tips

Addressing Challenges

Work collaboratively to address barriers and challenges to program success.

Be solution oriented.

Be inclusive to ensure different perspectives are represented such as lived experience, and organizations that are not always invited to the table but should be such as community transportation, libraries and public health departments.

Don't reinvent the wheel-research what is working elsewhere.

Think outside the box-open mindedness and creativity can encourage new ideas for solutions.

Champions:

In developing, implementing and growing deflection and pre-arrest programs n your community, seek out champions for your cause. They may be your usua social services and behavioral health partners, along with others such as health and human services agencies and public defenders.

Consider other community partners, such as librarians, elected officials and community leaders. Being inclusive provides the different perspectives necessary to collaboratively determine gaps and opportunities. Reach out to and communicate with others, educate them on your cause, and be ready to address their concerns ahead of time.

One such community resource to reach out to are the faith-based champions for change. For example, all across Florida, congregations have worked together to address community issues such as mental health, the environment, housing and criminal justice reform. They are active in representing their constituents in these and other areas determined by community need. They reach out to their community leaders to address these issues.

One such group is H.O.P.E. (Hillsborough Organization for Progress and Equity). Other groups have similar acronyms like F.A.S.T. (Faith and Action for Strength Together) or S.T.R.E.A.M. (Stronger Together Reaching Equality Across Manatee). They put together formal presentations, hold special meetings called Nehemiah Action, after Nehemiah 5:1-13, where using people power can achieve justice. They hold face-to-face direct-action meeting with decision makers and pre-arrest diversion and the expansion of such has beer one of their main priorities.
